

Welcome to Yass River – Nanima Bush Fire Brigade

When you join our Brigade you are also joining the RFS (NSW Rural Fire Service).

There is no joining fee but each year we ask for an annual donation in lieu of a fee.

The brigade and the RFS put a lot of time, effort and expensive equipment into ensuring our firefighters are well trained and not a danger to themselves or other brigade members in emergency situations.

All new members are required to complete an online Volunteer Induction (VI) and Safety Induction (SI) course. These short courses give you an understanding of how the RFS operates and how to participate in RFS activities safely. If your intention is to help with our key support activities such as fund-raising and catering, these courses are all you need to do.

If you want to take part in emergency operations you will also need to obtain the Bush Firefighter (BF) qualification.

Once you have your BF, there are many other nationally accredited courses you can undertake as you become more experienced and proficient.

<p>STEP 1: Try us out</p> <p><i>For address and contact information see page 2</i></p>	<p>Come along to training to see if fire brigade activities are something you would enjoy. We train regularly throughout the year at the brigade fire shed. Call us to find out when the next training session is on.</p>
<p>STEP 2: Apply for membership</p> <p><i>For RFS website address and captain's contact information see page 2</i></p>	<p>If you like what you see, apply for membership, using the online eMembership application form. You will need to scan and attach four types of ID (birth certificate, etc.) to the form. You also need to show the captain your original ID documents – a training night is often a suitable time. The captain validates and progresses your application. It takes time to process your application; meanwhile we encourage you to continue attending training and/or participating in support activities.</p>
<p>STEP 3: RFS accepts your application</p> <p><i>For ACTIV information and online apps stores, see page 2</i></p>	<p>The RFS notifies you your application has been accepted and gives you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a Firezone/SAP ID number in the RFS system. You will need this number throughout your time in the brigade, including for courses. Keep it safe. • a login to the RFS's member website, ONERFS. <p>You are now a probationary member of the brigade. You need to install the RFS ACTIV app on your mobile phone.</p>
<p>STEP 4: BF training</p> <p><i>For website addresses and other contact information, see page 2.</i></p>	<p>Once the RFS accepts your application, you may take the online induction course and the modules of the BF course through ONERFS. FUEL. You will need your ID number and a USI number (Australian Unique Student Identifier) to apply for each course. You complete the BF practical with the brigade then an assessment weekend in Yass/Goulburn/Crookwell: see the training calendar on our website. You will need your 'yellows'/ PPC (personal protective clothing) before the BF. Ask the captain to sign your PPC form then phone the RFS Yass Fire Control Centre (Fire Con) to check they have your size in stock. You may need to visit for a fitting. When it's available pick up your PPC from Fire Con. Once you have your BF, there are many other courses you can undertake as you become more experienced and proficient.</p>
<p>STEP 5: Brigade accepts you as a permanent member</p>	<p>After six months as a probationary member and having completed the induction courses, you are eligible to be accepted into the brigade as a permanent member, either an associate member or, if you have also obtained your BF certificate, an ordinary member. Your permanent membership is approved by a meeting of brigade members.</p>

The Captain, Deputies and Training Officer can assist with you with these steps. Just ask.
